When we think of February, some of the things that come to mind are groundhogs, Valentine's Day and cold temperatures. But there is also hope in February because regardless of if the groundhog sees his shadow, we know Spring is not too far away!

That sense of anticipation and promise we have as we look forward to Spring, is the same sentiment many of us are feeling as we consider the path forward regarding COVID-19. We know community transmission and positivity rates are still high in Lancaster, but these numbers and hospitalizations are coming down.

We are grateful that throughout Landis Communities, residents, clients, team members and families continue to follow these guidelines from the CDC to slow the spread of COVID-19:

- Get vaccinated and stay up to date on your COVID-19 vaccines.
- Wear a well-fitted mask to help protect yourself and others.
- Avoid crowds and poorly ventilated indoor spaces.
- Test to prevent spread to others.
- Stay 6 feet apart from others who don't live with you.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water aren't available.

Because of your diligent efforts in these areas, there has been very little transmission within residential living. Thank you!

In the past two weeks (1/26/22 - 2/8/22), 23 team members have tested positive. Resident and client cases include:

- 2 Landis Homes Residential Living residents
- 10 Landis Homes Personal Care residents
- 2 Landis Homes Healthcare residents
- 3 Landis Adult Day Services clients (not LH residents)
- 1 Landis at Home client (not LH resident)

No new cases have been reported at Steeple View Lofts or Welsh Mountain Home and WMH has completed outbreak testing of residents and team members. Outbreak testing continues for Landis Homes Healthcare and Personal care residents and team members.

Given the number of those infected with COVID-19, we are not quite ready to return to many pre-pandemic activities, but we believe the time is coming soon! To that end, the Landis Homes Reopening Teams will begin meeting again next week. We will look back at the activities and events that were enjoyed prior to restrictions and begin to find our way
