#### Landis Adult Day Services

They are now screening the participants three times a day – when they arrive, at 1:00 p.m., and when they leave the center. They are cleaning frequently touched areas every two hours and each time clients move from one area to another. Their gentle understanding of individual abilities to remember social distancing and wearing a mask, guides them as they provide support to some who attend the center. They have been creative in adapting activities or offering new activities that meet the need to social distance and limit commonly touched areas. Next week, as we recognize National Adult Day Services week, we will celebrate each of the staff members and participants who make ADS possible.

- **Confirmed Cases & Pending Tests –** Since last report, one Healthcare resident was tested and it has come back negative. We are not aware of any other residents with pending tests at Landis Homes.
- Fellowship Week –Thanks to all who were part of Fellowship Week! We hope you enjoyed the Ice Cream Social, Harvest Day, the Horse Power Parade, the Chicken BBQ and the Online Auction all in support of the Caring Fund! Those who won auction items may pick them up at the Crossings Main entrance today from 5-8 p.m., Thursday from 1-5 p.m. or Friday from 9 a.m. noon. We will soon share the total amount raised through the event, but when the auction closed on Sunday, items had received an average of 98% of their value. Fill the Gap contributions have now surpassed \$100,000! The generosity of this community is incredible.
- **Dining Services Changes** beginning September 21, the Owl Hill Bistro and Garden Café will be open for guests for Take-out only. Only team members and residents (not family members) are permitted in the seating areas.
- Routine Testing in Healthcare Routine testing of team members working in Healthcare areas resumed this week, as directed by CMS. Based on the current amount of COVID-19 in the county, this will continue weekly for team members. If a positive case is identified, resident testing and more frequent team member testing may be required. Positive tests will also set us back in the steps to reopening and result in visitation restrictions. Healthcare is currently in Step 3.
- **Compassionate Caregivers** The team continues to work on a plan for Compassionate Caregivers that is in line with the recent guidelines that allow this. The PA Department of Health is expected to provide further clarification soon.
- **Personal Care Reopening** Personal Care is also now in Step 3 of reopening. The details of the plan can be found on the Landis Homes website.
- **Concert on the Green** There will be a concert this Friday, September 18, at 6:00 p.m. on the Crossings Green. This concert is for residents only, no family members or guests are able to attend. Residents from Personal Care and Healthcare who wish to attend will be outside for the concert but will be assigned to certain seating areas with only those from their household. It is important that Residential Living residents refrain from entering the designated areas for Healthcare and Personal Care residents. We know this is difficult, but it will help to keep everyone safe while enjoying the concert.
- Visitors to Residential Living As a reminder, SCREENING IS REQUIRED FOR EVERYONE who visits the Landis Homes campus. Please remind your guests that they must register at a kiosk and receive a name badge before coming to see you in your apartment, hybrid or cottage home.
